West Kootenay Women's Festival

West Kootenays hosts Women's Festival in August

On August 11, 12 and 13, the West Kootenay Women's Festival will once more be the event to be part of in the B.C. Interior. This wonderful annual celebration has happened for over 20 years, and has become one of the best-known secrets shared around in the women's community in Western Canada. It takes place at the Vallican Whole Community Centre in the beautiful Slocan Valley (turn on to Hwy 6 between Castlegar & Nelson, watch for signs). You can get a brochure with a map from the Nelson & District Women's Centre, 420 Mill Street, Nelson, B.C. VIL 4R9. The Centre is open Tues. - Fri. in the afternoons.

The Festival Committee wants everyone to fully understand that this is a genuine Kootenay event by, for and about Kootenay women. If you're from somewhere else, you're welcome to come and share in the true Kootenay experience! Part of this experience is that women of all stripes (and believe us - both on the Committee and in the Kootenays at large, women come in every conceivable stripe!) are very friendly and tolerant towards women of all shapes, sizes and persuasions. The other part is that we all work together and every participant takes ownership of a little piece of the Festival by doing at least one hour of work to make the whole thing happen.

Work trades for admission are possible, and they must be arranged in advance. Don't wait to work these out at the door, as there are a limited number available. Women are asked to pay as much as they can, as this event is the main source of independent funds for the West Kootenay Women's Association.

Friday night will be a Literary Cabaret, co-hosted by the Kootenay School of Writing and featuring several well-known local writers. The Kootenays has a vibrant creative community in every aspect of the arts, and we will be privileged to share in some very exciting local work.

Saturday we will have an opening ceremony, including a square dance to get people's blood flowing! Registration starts at 9am, and it's advisable to get there early, or come on Friday, because once things get moving, they never stop. Saturday afternoon we will return to the early days of the Festival, with a genuine Open Stage, featuring several silly persons and as MCs two of our funniest local women, Nic and Tika, just to make sure the action never slows down. If you have been dying to strut your stuff, or if you've been a little bit shy to show what you can do, get there early and sign up. This could be the chance of a lifetime!

Saturday night will be The Dance, starting with drumming and singing by women from both the Kootenays and the Okanagan. After that, we'll move right into dancing to a local blues/rock band consisting of Bo, Norma, Grace and Carol (by then they'll no doubt have a snappy group name), who have been wowing women at local coffeehouses. The evening will wind up with local DJs' rompin' and stompin' favourites.

On both Saturday and Sunday, numerous workshops will take place all over the grounds. Some of what we hope to see are: bike repair; long-term relationships, both lesbian and heterosexual; battering in lesbian relationships; political organizing at a local level; reiki; ongoing drumming; rediscovering the goddess; voice; basic guitar; midwifery; and many more. We're even trying to get together a workshop on worm composting!

The Festival also includes a Craft Fair, featuring hand-made, woman-created arts and crafts. Women interested in selling at this event can still be included by calling the number below as soon as possible.

Camping is permitted on site, both quiet and not-so-quiet, but there are no showers. You are asked to preregister for childcare: on-site for 0-5-year-olds; and an off-site Children's Festival for children 6 and over. This latter event has become a big hit with the younger set. Boys over 6 are not allowed on the Festival grounds. They either sleep over at the Kids' Festival or come and sleep with their moms in a specially designated area.

Your Festival admission includes breakfast Saturday and Sunday, snacks, and a potluck dinner Saturday night. Please bring a contribution to Saturday night's potluck. Lunches are separate, and are fundraisers for other community organizations, so either come prepared to buy your lunches or to provide your own.

On Sunday, the Festival will be showcasing several of the Kootenays' most talented women performers in a concert we will all remember for a very long time. This concert will be promoted as a somewhat independent event, as these women deserve recognition for their outstanding talent, and will prove to be a considerable draw.

Admission to the Festival is by sliding scale, \$45 - \$70 for the whole thing. A further breakdown of the fee schedule can be obtained from the Nelson and District Women's Centre. This is an alcohol-free event, and you are asked to leave your dogs at home. (This is a rural area - they won't be allowed on site and they can't run).
