I am pleased to offer my support for your program "Gender, Trades and Technology – A Composite Approach," being submitted for funding to the Office of Status of Women Canada.

As we seek to find ways to address the skill shortage issues facing the region and province, we especially welcome efforts that will increase the participation of women in the trades as they remain a virtually untapped resource for employers.
