We have finished writing the business and marketing plan with the funding from Enterprising Non Profits thanks to Lyn Cayo, our cooperative and business consultant. Lyn worked with the women in this project to develop the needed awareness and skills for looking at the steps for creating a cooperative. We have moved up to the second floor which allows women to work and sew Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, 12 to 4pm each day. Join us!!!!
- <u>Free Store</u>— Clean up and renovation completed in January of this year!! Thanks to the Nelson and District Credit Union, our basement has been beautifully renovated!
