GOALS/OBJECTIVES ONTARIO NETWORK FOR WOMEN IN TRADES AND TECHNOLOGY

- information sharing
- to assist women to enter and maintain employment in trades and technology by providing a support group, information on opportunities and assisting the private and public sectors to plan and implement changes, to allow women an equitable share in this labour market.

- to serve as mentors to new women entering or wanting to enter the field

- to speak on behalf of the trades and technology women of Ontario
- to establish a network and be in touch with groups and individuals concerned with working, training, placement of tradesman
- establish a steering committee and get going on proposals for funding

- top priority is unity as tradesperson we need support from government to help in the public sector to get jobs, more organizations to help women find jobs, more publicity on us as hard working and capable trades people, private companies should know there are women out there interested in a life time career and a lot of us, how to fight discrimination in interviews.
